## A message from Vicar Deb...

*"Then Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, "If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples; and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free."*

John 8:31-32

We are in the time of Lent, a time of preparation, preparation for Easter. In Jesus final months on earth, Jesus tried to prepare his followers to continue His work after He was gone. Jesus shared his love and practices with his followers so they could disciple to others as he discipled to them. But they couldn't understand as they knew the ways and laws of the world but didn't quite understand the love and rule of Jesus.



We too use this time of Lent to prepare to be disciples of Jesus. Over the centuries, traditions have changed and evolved.

In the early church it was a time when adults who accepted Jesus as Lord and Savior would be baptized. In the Middle Ages, it was rare for anyone to be baptized as an adult and so it became a time for those separated from the church to repent and be forgiven so they could commune at Easter.

This time of repentance and spiritual renewal eventually became a tradition for the modern church. Lent is 40 days long (not counting Sundays) and is symbolic with the flood that renewed the Earth (Noah and the Arc), and with Israel's 40 years in the wilderness. It also reminds us of Jesus' 40 days of fasting and prayer in the wilderness before He began His ministry.

Today we celebrate Lent in different ways to prepare for Jesus' death and resurrection, and to prepare ourselves to be his disciples.

How do you use the time of Lent? Some give up meat on Fridays, some give up chocolate or caffeine. This is done to focus on eternal nourishment rather than earthly nourishment.

Some use the time for spiritual renewal. The time is used for deeper, more intentional Bible reading and prayer.

How are you using the time of Lent? How are you preparing to disciple for Jesus? This year our traditions are different. We have to do things differently; we get to do things differently; we may learn something new; we may hear God calling us in a different way. We may understand in a different way how Jesus is preparing us to disciple to others.

Some of us are like Peter who have a hard time adjusting and believing all of what Jesus is saying. Some of us are like Paul who once they see the light, become zealots for the Lord. Some of us are like Mary sitting and listening and learning as much as we can. Some of us are like Martha busily making everyone comfortable.

How are you using the time of Lent?

Stretch a bit and try a different prayer practice. Stretch a bit and dig into scripture a different way.

I pray that we can use our Lenten time to stretch into our new identity in Christ and prepare ourselves to disciple for Jesus. Amen! (Let it be so.) *Vicar Deb Monnin*

**Did you notice our Lenten Scripture Themes?** *This year, the Sundays in Lent lead us to focus on five covenants God makes in the Hebrew Scriptures and to use them as lenses through which to view baptism.*

1<sup>st</sup> week: God promises to wash us clean with water

2<sup>nd</sup> week: God Promised Abraham and Sarah that they would be the ancestors of many, the foundation of our faith

3<sup>rd</sup> week: Join us on Sunday or Wednesday and see!!

## **Announcements from Council**

We are very excited to announce that at our Congregational Meeting held on February 14<sup>th</sup>, FELC committed itself to the Shared Ministry Agreement to raise up and support Vicar Deb Monnin as she attends seminary and prepares herself to become an ordained pastor of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America (ELCA). This long-term commitment will include the period of Vicar Deb's seminary education, ordination, and first three-year call. FELC's commitment to the shared ministry agreement officially removes FELC from the call process. Council is working with the Northwest Ohio Synod to make preparations for Vicar Deb's installation at FELC and will share more detailed information when it becomes available.

Council approved the creation of a finance workstation in the choir room. FELC budgeted for and purchased Quickbooks accounting software but needed newer and more capable computer hardware to utilize this software as intended. Council authorized the use of funds from the Vohs Technical Endowment to purchase a professional grade office desktop, document scanner, and power backup at an estimated total cost of \$1200-\$1400 for the creation of the finance workstation, which should be fully operational by early March.

Council updated the COVID-19 Guidelines to allow food at FELC sponsored events and private events hosted by FELC members. Effective immediately, we can hold events with food in the Fellowship Hall for up to 55 persons when the appropriate precautions and requirements are followed. The new guidelines outlining these precautions are published in full in this newsletter and at [myfelc.org](http://myfelc.org) and will be posted throughout the building. Please familiarize yourself with these changes and direct any questions or concerns to Vicar Deb Monnin or Council President Chuck Curry or any member of Church Council. Fellowship Committee will begin providing refreshments in the Fellowship Hall starting on April 11, 2021 following worship.

### **COVID-19 Guidelines for all Activities at First English Lutheran Church\***

1. Individuals should remain at least six feet from people from outside the individual's household to the extent feasible. An individual's household is defined loosely as those persons with whom you have regular close contact with outside of church.
2. When seated, rows of chairs will be organized so that there is six feet of space between rows and six feet of space between households. In the sanctuary, every other row will be closed and congregants are expected to maintain six feet of space between households.
3. Those individuals who pose the greatest threat to others are asked to not attend events at FELC. This would include:

- A. Persons who are sick, not feeling well, or have experienced a fever greater than 100.3 in the last 3 days
  - B. Anyone who in the past 14 days has had close contact with someone who has or is suspected of having COVID-19.
4. Persons age 65 or older or have underlying health conditions or do not yet feel comfortable in communal settings may choose to worship or participate using other accommodations that we make available, such as livestreams and recordings.
  5. Anyone who attends activities at FELC are required to wear a face covering or mask while indoors. Children two years old or younger should not wear a mask. Vocal soloists and speakers may remove their masks when engaged in their respective activities, but will need to maintain 12 feet of distance from others.
  6. High-touch areas will be sanitized after each activity at the church and hand sanitizer will be made available at multiple locations throughout the building.
  7. Areas of the church may be blocked off to reduce the need to disinfect them or because they have not been disinfected since their last use. Please do not enter these areas unless it is absolutely necessary.
  8. All facility usage must be reported to Brenda Shoffstall at (419) 233-1956 to ensure the proper cleaning and disinfecting of these spaces.
  9. Access to church facilities will be limited to a short time before and after a scheduled event.

### **Additional COVID-19 Guidelines for Worship Services at First English Lutheran Church**

1. Congregants are expected to limit movement in the sanctuary and overflow area during worship. Children will receive the children's message from their seats. Lectors may be provided a microphone to deliver the readings from their seats.
2. Offering trays will be placed at the back of the sanctuary and overflow areas.
3. The following activities are suspended until further notice:
  - A. Large singing or performance ensembles
  - B. Staffed infant and toddler nursery
4. Greeters will be positioned to allow for proper social distancing and will engage in non-contact greetings.
5. Ushers will dismiss the congregation systematically to avoid congregating in the hallways and common areas.

\*In the event that these guidelines are more restrictive than the current guidance from state authorities, FELC will defer to what is allowable under the current law.



## **Additional COVID-19 Guidelines for Use of the Fellowship Hall\***

1. All events in the Fellowship Hall are limited to 55 persons, roughly 20% of maximum occupancy.
2. Plated, brown-bag, prepackaged, or carry-in meals or snacks are permitted at FELC sponsored events and private events hosted by members of FELC.
  - A. Buffet style service is only permitted if participants or volunteers are designated to serve individuals going through the buffet line.
  - B. FELC will not be expected to provide volunteers to staff or serve at such events.
3. Persons who use the Fellowship Hall will be responsible for setting up, disinfecting, and putting away their own tables and chairs as instructed.
4. The Fellowship Hall will only be open to host one event per day.
  - A. Wednesdays are reserved for Catechism and Christian education.
  - B. Thursdays are reserved for Loaves and Fishes.
  - C. Multi-day events are permitted in the Fellowship Hall, but they must not interfere with already scheduled events.
5. Social distancing guidelines as defined elsewhere in this document will apply at all times.
6. Masks or facial coverings must be worn at all times unless a participant is actively engaged in one of the following activities; presenting, performing, eating, or drinking. As noted above in the general guidelines, unmasked presenters or performers must maintain 12 feet of distance from persons who are not members of their household.
7. FELC will make every reasonable effort to promote the safety and wellness of persons participating in events and activities held at its facilities, but FELC will not be held financially or otherwise liable for personal injury or illness resulting from participation in events or activities occurring at its facilities.
8. Hosts of events or activities at FELC will be required to do the following:
  - A. Sign the indemnity agreement contained in the FELC facility use guidelines.
  - B. Notify event participants that they are accepting all risk of injury or illness resulting from their participation in the event or activity.
  - C. Ensure that all participants are presented with FELC's COVID-19 Guidelines
