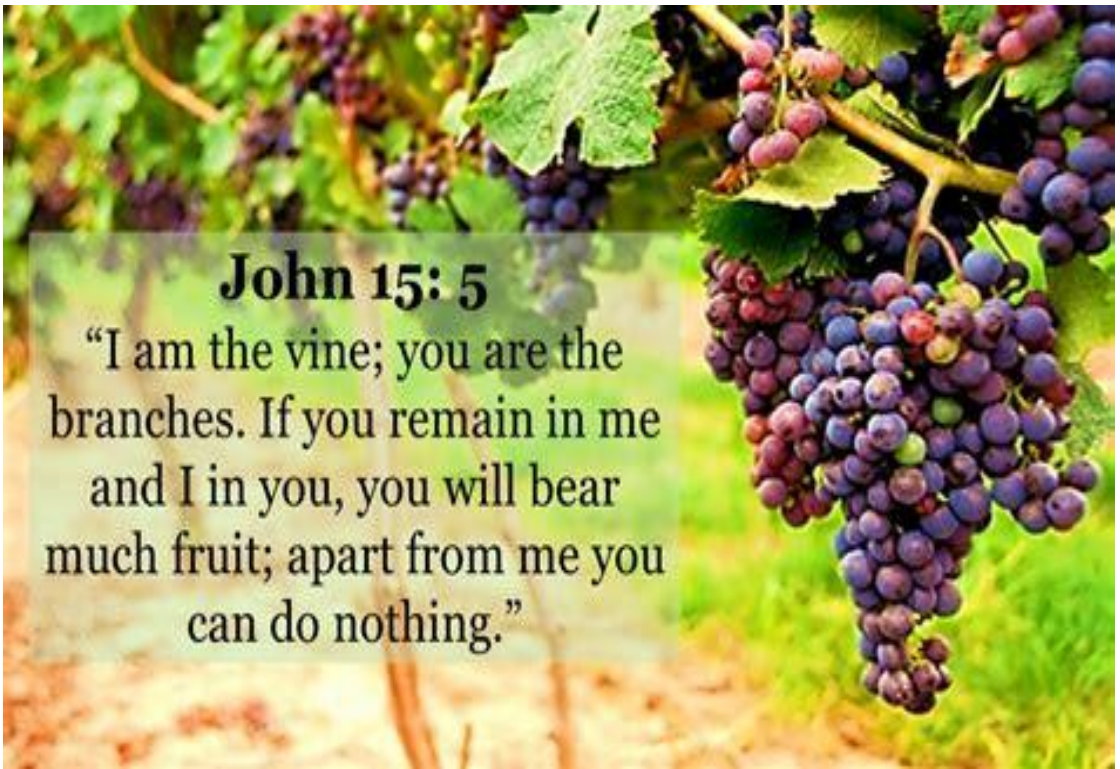

A message from Vicar Deb...

"I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned." John 15:5-6



Whenever I think of this verse, I think of roses... my father-in-law has roses like this. They are beautiful and smell great. However, one year, the winter was extra cold, and the roses froze below the line where they were grafted onto the main stem. The next spring, roses bloomed, but they were small and not as pretty. You see, roses like these are fragile. They look pretty, but they can't sustain themselves over our cold winters. So, gardeners graft the pretty flowers to hardy rose bushes, and we are able to enjoy beauty year after year.

Jesus is like that hardy rose bush plant, and we are like those pretty, yet fragile roses. He is the vine and we who are connected to Jesus, we are his branches. Because we abide in Jesus' love, and are connected to His branch, we are strong in love, and strong in Jesus. We can withstand anything the world sends. The Spirit moves in us and through the Spirit we are given energy, and love and our way becomes clear.

Sometimes though, we find ourselves connected to something not of God, the spirit is not with us, and we find ourselves dragging. We might even feel like we are cut off from the world and from God's love. In those times, life can be difficult.

Jesus tells us in John 15, that all who are not abiding in God's love should be cut off and burned!! WHEW that seems harsh... I use to think that those people would be separated from God, and that is true, but it's not God who is pruning us. We humans separate ourselves from God's love through our shame or embarrassment or just plain behavior that is not of God.

So how do you decide if what you are doing is of God? Take some quiet time and pray using the Examine practice. Reflect on your life the last week or month or year and jot down on the left side of the page where you have felt love, and energy. Then jot down on the right side of the page where you have felt emptiness and darkness. The Spirit is with you in those things on the left side of the page. Continue to pay attention to those and build on those. And those on the right side, continue to notice them, and pray about them. Perhaps it's time to hand those off and let them be pruned. Maybe they will be life giving again, but maybe it's time to let them be for now.

So, remember that we are like that pretty rose bush. We need to be connected to the main stem to have a full and life giving life. Jesus is the main stem, and we are filled with the Holy Spirit, grafted to Jesus, and are called to go forth to spread love to all of God's creation.

Take time this month to Lean into the Spirit, and notice all the Spirit filled gifts from God in your life. Amen. *Vicar Deb Monnin*

Where is the Holy Spirit working in our Community?

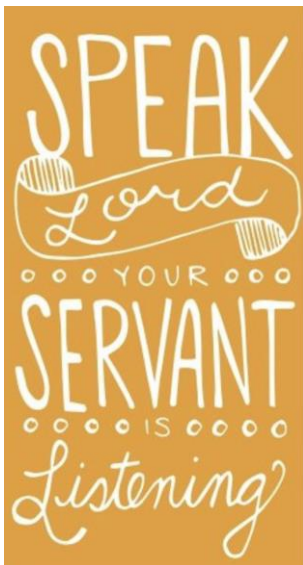
Thank: Thank you for helping us create a wonderful Easter celebration by sharing your gifts of flowers, music or special offering.

Highlights from Church Council's April 25th Meeting

Update on the Sanctuary Air Conditioning System

Council reviewed bids from four local contractors to replace the four ductless cooling units in the sanctuary. After reviewing the bids, Council selected one contractor's bid that we would like to put before the congregation for approval at an upcoming congregational meeting. At this time, the date for the congregational meeting has not been set, but we anticipate that this meeting will occur in late May or very early June. If the congregation approves the replacement of the project, the contractor anticipates that they will be able to start the project two weeks later. Council has also asked the Finance Committee to make a recommendation for funding this project should it be approved by the congregation. The formal announcement of the congregational meeting, the details of the winning bid, the Finance Committee's funding recommendation, and additional supporting information will be sent out in the coming weeks. Thank you all for your patience as we work to address this issue!

We are Still Seeking Your Ideas and Input

We have held three open meetings to brainstorm about our ideas for how to better utilize and update some of our lesser used spaces. The results of these sessions have been posted in the hallway in Melching Hall outside of the old nursery.
