# A Message from Vicar Deb



Seek first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. Matthew 6:33

God's Kingdom - where do you see God's Kingdom? When I was younger, I thought of God's kingdom as the place I would go to after I died. I look forward to being in Heaven with Jesus and with all the people who went before me. God's kingdom is certainly there.

As I've gotten older I've noticed God's kingdom right here. God's kingdom is wherever God's love and works are being done. God's kingdom is here when we love one another. God's kingdom is here when we help each other out. God's kingdom is here when we uphold justice for God's people.

Where have you experienced God's kingdom? I've experienced God's kingdom in the fellowship here after worship. I've noticed the love of God's kingdom in the meals and fellowship given to and for the families who are grieving their loved one. The weekend backpacks of food that we provide to the school kids each week are also where God's kingdom reigns as they help the needy and hungry in our community.

Where have you noticed God's right-eous-ness? Right-eous-ness abounds when God's love and justice reigns. God leads us and encourages us to create his kingdom right here on earth, right here where we are.

I have noticed God's righteousness when doors are held for others, when people stop and talk with the stranger or visitor, when we stand up for our neighbor near or far.

But sometimes I struggle to be God's witness, especially when I think I need to have something done or if I have to be somewhere. It sometimes shows up when I'm waiting in line at the check out line at the store. I sometimes get frustrated with the whole situation, with the people who are struggling to carry their stuff, or with the cashier who has to call for a price check. I have noticed though, that if I put myself in their shoes, and if I share the love that Christ shares with me, the whole experience improves. I find I'm no longer as frustrated and the whole experience is better for all. I may even meet someone friendly! Do you ever struggle to be God's witness in this world?

Jesus asks us to seek first the kingdom of God – to lift up the sad and lonely, to lift up those who are hurting, to help those who have been downtrodden. When we look into God's kingdom and lift up others in God's name, our worries seem to lessen. Thank you Jesus – thank you for opening our eyes and hearts to your love, to your kingdom, and to your right-eous-ness! *Vicar Deb*

**Service:** How might you reach out to those in the community who may need to hear a friendly voice, to receive a nice card, or who may need a helping hand? Who is God putting in front of you today?




