## ***A Message from Vicar Deb***



*And the Word became flesh and lived among us,  
and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a  
father's only son, full of grace and truth.*

John 1:14

Can you imagine God's glory? I sure can't...I mentioned a couple of weeks ago that we can't really describe God. We can't even begin to know God and God's glory. God is bigger and larger than we can even dream! When I think of God's glory I think of looking at a really really bright light – and when I do, I feel heat that strong strong heat on my face and I can't see anything else around that bright light, and even when I look away, all I can see are spots from that really really bright light. I imagine God's glory being like that. Indescribable, and yet warm and welcoming.

This scripture from John says that we HAVE SEEN his glory – a glory full of grace and truth. Jesus came into the world so we could see just a little bit of that glory. So we could connect with God in a personal real way. Jesus lives and walks amongst us – we have stories of what Jesus did, when he was truly human living as one of us on earth oh so long ago – connecting with the blind man and healing him, really seeing and talking with Zaccheus a tax man to be avoided, sitting and eating with the disciples, and even calling out the pharisees when he challenged their beliefs. God in Jesus came into the world into His creation and became one of us. God humbled himself to live and suffer and love amongst us, and God is still here living in you and me, sharing grace and truth every day.

God's glory comes through in our everyday life, in the connections we make, even in the ones we have yet to meet. I saw God's glory in the eyes and energy of the youth who portrayed the baptism of Jesus during the drive through nativity in December as they dance in the cold and acted out the different ways to baptize with water. I saw God's glory in the energy and care of all the people who helped make the youth Christmas pageant wonderful. I see God's glory in your day to day interactions with each other – when you are working together for the good of the other. I see God's glory when we really really share something hard to share. Because my friends, it's really hard to share hard news – to share something that might cause another pain, or to share something that still hurts so bad that you might break down in sharing it. But my friends God's glory is there, surrounding you with God's warmth and love – full of grace and truth. God's glory shines through you as you hear that hard bit of news and just sit and listen and really be with your friend in Jesus through that hard thing. God's glory, full of grace and truth is in you!

I encourage you in the coming days and month to look around and wonder with me... where are you experiencing God's glory today, full of grace and truth? *Vicar Deb*

### **First English's Stewardship Corner:**

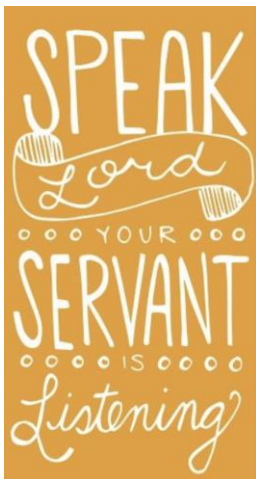
Where is the Holy Spirit working in our community?

### **Vicar Deb's Seminary Experience:**

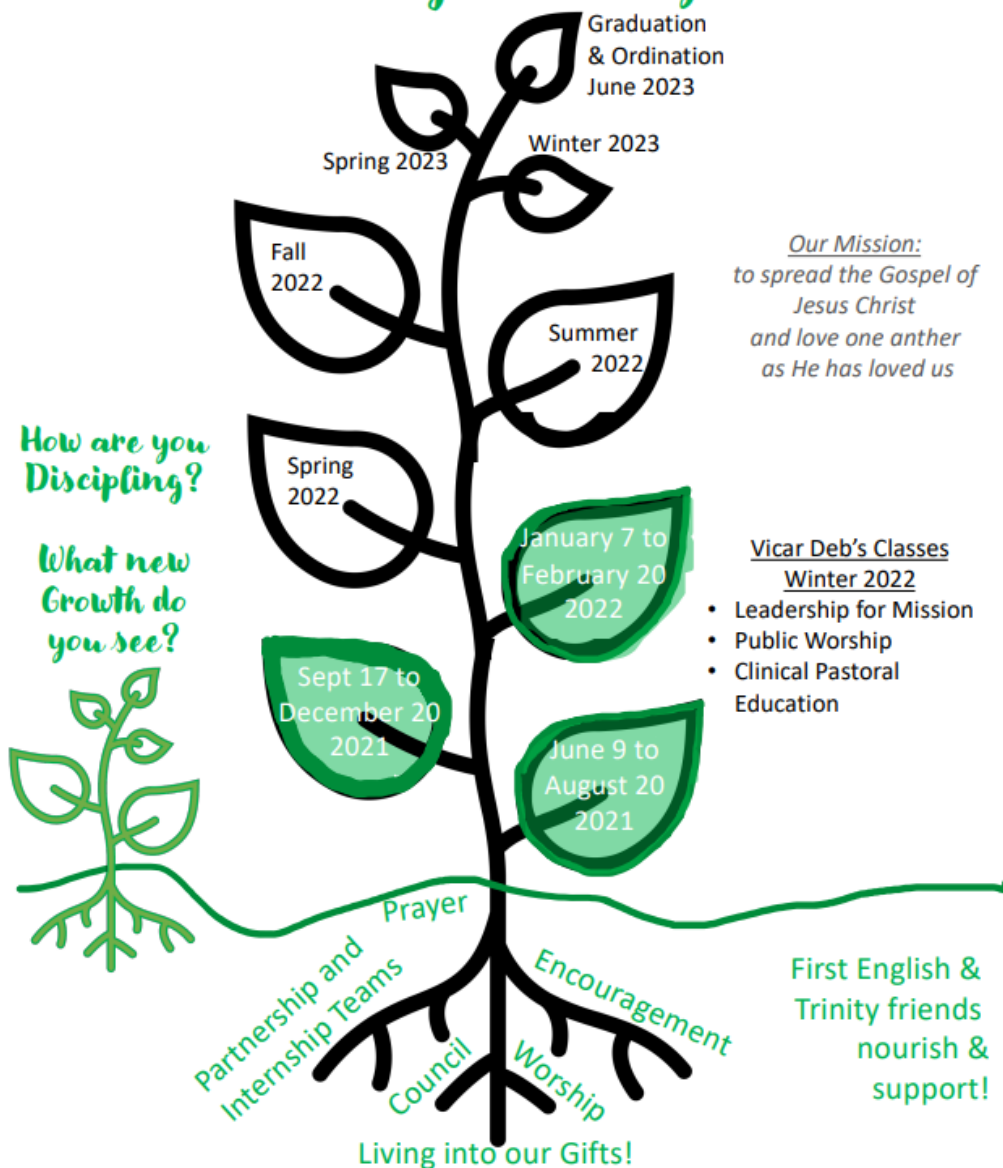
Thank you all for supporting me and praying for me as I attend Seminary.

### **Position: Bookkeeper Part-Time**

#### **Job Duties**

First English Lutheran Church is in need of a bookkeeper to accurately process and document all donations, interest payments, invoice payments, reimbursement requests, payroll and payroll tax payments, and account transfers in QuickBooks. The bookkeeper will also be responsible for reconciling all bank accounts, closing the monthly, quarterly, and yearly ledger, performing all required monthly, quarterly, and annual financial reports, and performing other activities as directed.

#### **Working Conditions**

The bookkeeper works in the church's financial office with the Financial Secretary and Treasurer and reports to the Treasurer, Pastor, and Church Council. This is a part-time position and does not require a set schedule, but many of the bookkeeper's duties do have associated deadlines which must be met. The performance of the bookkeeper's duties should require, on average, 2-4 hours per week.

## Qualifications

Candidates for this position should be familiar with computers, computer programs such as Excel, Word, and QuickBooks, data entry, financial record keeping principles, account reconciliation processes, financial reporting, payroll and tax forms, and must possess excellent attention to detail.

Candidates must be authorized to work in the United States without sponsorship and will be asked to submit to a background check and drug test prior to being hired for this position.

## Pay and Benefits

The salary for this position will be commensurate with education and experience and will reflect the expected time commitment.
