## A Message from Vicar Deb

God saw everything that he had made, and indeed, it was very good. Genesis 1:31



In the beginning, God created – God created the world, God created all that is in it, and God declared it Good. God also created you and me, and God declares you and me good also!

God created the world and all that is in it to be in balance, but sometimes because of sin and our own human egos we become out of balance.

We want to live as the world defines us – we want what others have, we don't take the time – or maybe we push down who God created us to be – and things get out of whack. They get out of whack in

simple ways or complex ways – Simple, like, -I might think I need to dress or act like that other person who is popular or seems to have it all together – when really those clothes or that behavior is not becoming on me.

Or things might get out of whack because we might try to live out our life or our jobs which are not in jive with where God is leading us at that time and in that moment. Let me explain with my life – and maybe you can see it in your life also.

When I was a younger person - I felt called to be an engineer and work hard - full time plus to help make things better in the refrigeration industry. I also felt called to marry Bruce and raise a family - and that was good - I - for the most part felt good and aligned with God and Where God was leading me. I felt in balance

And then – about 8-10 years ago I felt an urging to do something else, but wasn't sure what – I felt pulled to help others more directly and so I started searching and praying more about that – eventually it led to time off from work – a forced pause -a good pause – It was the time of the COVID shut down and I was able to be still and pray and also help others more directly.

You know the rest -during that time I was pulled to try preaching, to become a SAM, to be appointed here, and to go to seminary...It's been a full couple of years, and now as I discern and pray about where God is calling me, these things seem important:

I feel led to continue to serve in the parish – to share the word of God, to help others see God's action in their life and to help others grow into their calling as a disciple. I also feel

called to serve and care for my family – to be available if anyone needs help – our parents are nearby and healthy, and we want to enjoy them, our children are nearby and now we also have our Grandson Jack, whom we want to enjoy –

As I've prayed, and listened to God, and tried to align with where God is calling me to live a good and holy life – I feel called to serve in the parish part time and also feel called to serve and support my family the remainder of the time –

But it's not all about me – God is calling you also – In Matthew 28, Jesus said – go therefore and make disciples – you are being called just as I am, to disciple to others – You have been given gifts to disciple – some are teachers, some are preachers, some are bakers and some are visitors – you pray and carry God's love where ever you go –

Now I know it's different to consider a part time pastor serving in a church like First English – but in God, there is enough. God provides – if we find ourselves lacking, maybe we are not listening and following God? Or maybe our timing is not God's timing?

And so – How might God be leading us together? Several months ago this part time call became more clear to me – and another thing became clear to me – I believe God is putting another idea in front of us – this second thing that became clear is this:

We have talented, gifted disciples, in this congregation – could it be that we together can serve as God is calling? Could it be that together we serve the people and community in and around First English?

I think so – we have hired a talented Christian Ed director in Rebecca and I believe we have talented people here who can lead through their gifts in visitation and in social outreach. Could we consider serving together as God is calling us? Could we consider the office of the pastor include more than one person??

You see – all through life – through all of our phases or seasons God is calling you and me to be who God creates us to be – and God continues to create – God continues to call us to God – it is not a one time creation –

So in the next weeks and months – I invite you to ponder and pray and listen to where God is calling you – and where God is leading First English – I believe God gives us all that we need - and I believe that we together can serve here in this congregation and in this area as God is calling us and leading us.

God calls us to be close to God and God gives us purpose – And God said it is Good. AMEN

Where are you noticing God's action in your week? This month I invite you to take time at the end of the day or week and reflect on your day and week... where were you surprised? Where were you disappointed? Where were you delighted? I invite you then to jot it down in a notebook or in your phone - and lift a prayer to God. Invite God to be with you in your joy and also in your disappointment. Ask God to walk with you and to bring people into your life who may share with you your highs and lows - share out loud with your friend these highs and lows - God is with you - leading and guiding you through this practice of listening and sharing .... You can't do it wrong - you are not alone - God is with you and so am I - Vicar Deb




## **Vicar Deb's Seminary Experience:**
