Something to Ponder

Christ Jesus, though of God, did not cling to equality with God, but in complete self-emptying took the place of a slave, born a human. And as a human, in profound humility, Christ became obedient to the point of death even death on a cross. Therefore God also highly exalted Christ with the name that is above every name.... —Philippians 2.6-9

Humility enables us to take the lowest place, or the highest, and serve as a vessel of God's grace. It is usually the lowest place, free of privilege, power or prestige, where grace is most clear.

As you read it, I invite you to notice what words or phrases stick out to you?

This particular scripture from Philippians is called the "Christ Hymn" and it's been sticking with me over the past couple of weeks. I wonder – do you ever have songs or scriptures which stick with you? They might come to the top of mind when you least expect it, like when you are waking up or when you are going from here to there.

This text and meditation has been sticking with me – and the words which stick out almost every time are "self-emptying," "profound humility," and "circle." In this hymn and in this meditation, I'm reminded of how God in Jesus gave up God's power for us. God in Jesus came to earth and did not use his Godly powers. Rather God in Jesus gave up his position so that he could be with people who have no power. God in Jesus came and ate with the hungry, the unseen, the ones being ignored and not heard.


I like how Pastor Steve Garnaas-Holmes explains humility as being part of a circle, one part in the whole of creation. When we are in a circle, no one is higher or lower, no one is stronger or weaker, no one has more power over another – all of our talents and strengths are valued. In a circle, everyone is seen, no one is hidden. No one is trampled.

I invite you to ponder the Christ Hymn with me this month – this month in which we remember Jesus who died sharing God's love, grace, and humility. I invite you to pray with me: Humble Lord, God of all Creation, help me to walk with you, to carry your grace and love and humility in my very being, so that others may see you, through me. AMEN

Vicar Deb's Seminary Experience:

Thank you all for supporting me and praying for me as I attend Seminary. I'm in the last semester and will finish the end of May. It's a busy time – and I'm looking forward to graduating, and yet feeling melancholy that I won't have this period of intense learning and will not see many of my classmates and teachers in person again.

This term, I'm taking four classes, the Bible through Women's Eyes, the Book of Job, Theological Frameworks for Ministry, and Scripture and its Witnesses. In Job, we've been wrestling with why bad things happen to good people. In those times and even now, we think that if we live good lives and if we follow all the rules, everything will work out fine. In the grand scheme of things and certainly in communities, that is true. However, individually we find, as Job did, that there is personal pain and suffering. We might ask why? ... often times, like in Job, we there is no answer. Thankfully, God comes to us through our friends and through nature and shows that us that God cares for all of creation – it's not just about us. In that wide view, there is hope. God is with us – in the tough and the good times.

Announcements from Council

Council met after worship on March 5, 2023. We reviewed the business reports and approved them along with amending one of the reports for our minutes.

We then looked at the committee reports and approved them.

Staff support will be meeting with Vicar Deb on April 26 to see how they can help along with the other people on staff at other times.

We discussed the need to reach out to our members to help on a stewardship committee. Brenda will be glad to hear from anyone that would like to help with this much needed effort. We will also be looking at some synod resources.

On March 30, Council, Vicar Deb, internship committee and our Synod facilitator will be meeting to discuss how we can move forward in the coming months.

We approved 2 weeks of Vacation for our office administrator position.

Brenda read a letter of resignation from our bookkeeper, Chad Sterner due to his increased job commitments. He has done a wonderful job.

Next month, we will be sharing with the congregation what the priorities of the surveys have shown along with concerns given. We want to thank everyone that has taken the time to give us your thoughts as we move forward in decisions that will be made in the coming months.

Thank you for putting your trust in our council. We, along with committees are working hard to make our church stronger and serving God.

Overview of Survey Responses

The Council and Internship committee are working with Synod to relay the 5 most important focus points of a pastor as expressed by the congregation surveys. 1. Be an effective communicator. 2. Be effective in working with the youth. 3. Be active in visitation of members and nonmembers. 4. Help people develop their spiritual life. 5. Be an effective teacher. Building a sense of community and a commitment to the Lutheran Church were also highly valued by our respondents.

The most frequent concerns of the congregation in the comments were: 1. Full time pastor versus part-time pastor. 2. A pastor who has a visible presence at church events and in the community. 3. Are there enough volunteers to fill in the gaps if we have a part-time pastor? 4. Budgetary concerns on compensation of a pastor. 5. Having open communication at the church.

Explanation of the Shared Ministry Agreement

Several survey respondents were curious why we entered into shared ministry agreement with Trinity Lutheran in Moulton. The following are the primary reasons FELC needed to enter the agreement with Trinity to hire Vicar Deb as our Synodically Authorized Minister in August of 2020 and why we have continued to uphold this partnership.

- Vicar Deb was not even enrolled in seminary yet when she joined us in the summer of 2020. She had completed Diakonia classes and became a Synodically Authorized Minister, or SAM) shortly after she joined us, but she was not ready and able to minister to a congregation without a supervisor as is typically the case with SAM's. Because of this, our synod always appoints a mentoring pastor to partner with new SAMs. Pastor Meldoi, from Trinity, was familiar with Deb and had been walking alongside her as Vicar Deb listened for where God was calling her. Pastor Meldoi feels called to raise up lay leaders who are feeling called into ministry. Having Pastor Meldoi as Vicar Deb's supervisor/mentor was an obvious choice for the Synod Office, and FELC's President and Vice President.
- When Vicar Deb entered seminary she needed a supervisor. This would usually be done by the pastor at the congregation where they are serving, but since we had no pastor to supervise Vicar Deb, Pastor Melodi was able to continue to serve us as Vicar Deb's supervisor.
- Vicar Deb's seminary only allows her to preach 2 Sundays a month, really to spend time writing two sermons a month, so one Sunday a month she repreaches one of her sermons at Trinity and we are blessed with having Pastor Melodi come and lead us and share a message with us.

We thank everyone who participated in the survey, and we will continue to keep the congregation informed as we move forward at FELC.
