The Parables of the Seeds ---



"Jesus replied, 'for in gathering the weeds you would uproot the wheat along with them. Let both of them grow together until the harvest...". Matthew 13:29-30a

I love looking at the fields this time of year. What's planted? Corn, beans, wheat, alfalfa? It's fun to see how much they've grown from day to day or week to week!

But sometimes there are weeds in the fields – sometimes things pop up which were not planted. Sometimes surprises come up which we didn't expect. It happens in our fields and gardens and in our life.

Surprises – plans change, people get sick, jobs end, kids do unexpected things, cars break, Surprises. Some are good, some take a while to adjust to. What do we do in the meantime? Do we try to stop the surprise? Do we ignore it? What do we do?

When the farmers in Biblical times had weeds crop up in their fields, they knew it would reduce the harvest. In those days and sometimes today – that might mean the difference between having enough to eat all through the winter or starving. So, you can understand why the farmers would want to pull the weeds right out as soon as they spotted one. But Jesus said – let them grow – we'll sort them out later.

I wonder if the farmers asked Jesus Why?? Why would we jeopardize what we KNOW to be true – what we KNOW will cause us loss? Why Jesus, why would we let that weed grow, knowing it'll cause problems? And Jesus said wait – wait because there's a bigger thing going on.

I wonder if we do the same today? How often do we want the answer now? How often do we want to know which path to take? How often do we wonder why this weed or pain or hard thing is coming up in our life right now?

Jesus invites us to wait – to wait until the harvest and separate them out then. Perhaps that thing we think is a weed in our life is something that brings joy? Or helps us see something else clearly? And in our waiting what are we to do? Pray, Check on our neighbors, Take care of what comes. Enjoy the gifts God provides right now. Feel the sun and trust in God's wisdom. May God be with you and May God bring patience and calmness in the waiting – AMEN –

Homeless Ministry

Homelessness is a growing concern in Auglaize County. We currently know of about 150 homeless individuals living in Auglaize County. We think that figure could be much higher because it can be hard to identify the homeless. Homelessness isn't just people sleeping on park benches or holding up cardboard signs, it also includes people living out of their car and individuals who are crashing at a friend's place. Is that person waiting in their car for the store to open or is that where they slept last night? Is that young lady in the lobby waiting to be picked up from work or does she have nowhere else to go? It's hard to tell.

For the past year, First English has quietly gotten more involved in ministering to the homeless and housing insecure residents of Auglaize County. In cooperation with several local agencies and organizations, including the Wapakoneta Area Ministerial Association, Candle of Hope (the Auglaize County Homeless Coalition), God's Storehouse, Agape Ministries (St. Marys), Mercy Unlimited, The Salvation Army, Loaves and Fishes, and several local churches, FELC has taken a key role in combating homelessness and food and housing insecurity in our community.

Typically, these efforts have had one of two objectives depending on the individual's situation; for the person just passing through, we might provide a hot meal and a tank of gas or a night in a hotel, but for the person facing long-term homelessness, we try to walk alongside them and help them reach a point of stabilization. Stabilization is a point where the household has a reliable source of income that covers their housing costs and basic needs. Unfortunately, it can take several months to reach a point of stability. Sometimes households reach out for help early enough that we have an opportunity to prevent homelessness, perhaps by helping with food or gas or a utility bill. More often, however, we work with households that are already homeless. For these households the first two things we work on are short-term housing and employment.

Auglaize County does not have a homeless shelter, so short-term housing might be crashing on a friend's couch, a hotel room, sleeping in their car, or even camping at a local campground. Employment is a key component of the transition to stability, because most of the aid available to them requires proof of income. Additionally, employment empowers the individual to be an active participant in changing their circumstances. We make it clear that we are offering a hand up, not handouts. Often there are issues preventing them from finding employment such as a lack of valid ID, a suspended license, a criminal background, or lack of transportation. Through our partner agencies we are able to help them overcome these issues by guiding them through the maze of paperwork, connecting them with employers willing to look beyond a past mistake, and occasionally asking for donations of bikes or camping equipment.
