### The Calm in the Storm ---



"But when he noticed the strong wind, he became frightened, and beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!" Jesus immediately reached out his hand and caught him," Matthew 14:30-31a

Have you ever gotten into a jam? Or been in a situation where you are overwhelmed?

Oftentimes it happens when unexpected things come up – Peter and the disciples had had a long day. They

had just heard that John the baptizer had been killed, and then they went with Jesus to pray, but many people followed them. So Jesus shifted gears and took care of the people – 5000+ were fed. When they were finished Jesus sent the disciples in a boat across the sea to the next place, while Jesus stayed and prayed. A long day – full of emotion – and then one more thing came upon them – a big storm. The disciples were afraid – they were afraid of the storm, afraid what the world might do to them. Afraid. Jesus appeared, walking on the water towards them and said, "do not be afraid" and brought a sense of calm.

Now this is a familiar story – we've all heard of Jesus and Peter walking on water – but the thing that stood out to me today was the fact that Jesus immediately extended his hand and brought calmness and comfort. Peter was still in the water, the winds were still raging and Jesus brought calmness and peace. Jesus appeared just when Peter and the disciples most needed him.

Many times in life we are hit with more than we can handle. We are hit with surprise illnesses, surprise job changes, surprise car or house issues, surprises in our family. Or maybe the surprises on their own are no big deal, but when stacked upon each other they are too much. It feels like we are in the storm and are being battered by the people around us or by the storms of life that come upon us.

What storms are upon you right now? Or maybe what storms have you weathered? I invite you to ponder them, to name them, and then look to Jesus – Look out of your battered boat and notice - notice the rock of Jesus who reaches out his hand and catches you just as he catches Peter.

This picture is of a rock in the storm, bringing calm. This stack of rocks is sometimes called an Inukshuk – a pile of rocks that the native American Inuit people piled up to let others know that they were not alone. These are especially helpful in stormy or secluded areas. They can provide a bit of calmness and assurance that Jesus is with you!

When you find yourself in the storms of life, I invite you to look out, notice Jesus, the true rock, and remember that you are not alone – Jesus brings calm, brings friends who have gone before, and Jesus brings Peace – even while the storm rages. Come Lord Jesus.

# **Community Snapshot: Mercy Unlimited**

Mercy Unlimited was founded in 1989 when a local group of community members noticed a growing need for food assistance within the community. The mission statement of Mercy Unlimited is to reflect the love of Christ by ministering onto those who are hungry, thirsty, homeless in need of clothing, sick, or imprisoned.

The hungry and thirsty are served through our food pantry where we provide emergency food assistance to households experiencing food insecurity. Clients are welcome to shop at our choice food pantry once every 30 days where food is provided as well as health and hygiene items, cleaning supplies and toiletries.

Also, through the food pantry, we have a weekend backpack program where we provide food to students who face food insecurity over the weekend when school breakfasts and lunches are not available. Our staff and volunteers pack enough food for each student to cover all meals through the weekend until their arrival back at school on Monday morning. Each student receives twenty-eight meals per month. Through our micro pantries we also stock and provide ready to eat food, health and hygiene, items, and other items requested by the staff at our local schools to be distributed to students in need.

Also, through our food pantry we provide a monthly food box to homebound seniors, who otherwise would experience food insecurity. Our staff and volunteers prepare the food boxes once a month and the food boxes are delivered by the Auglaize County Council on Aging (ACCA) directly to the seniors' homes.

We are facing an ever-growing homeless situation in Auglaize County. We partner with other agencies to try to provide temporary emergency shelter, food, and other needs of those experiencing homelessness. Those in need of clothing and unable to obtain it on their own are provided with a voucher so they may shop for free within our thrift store.

We also provide chaplain services at the Auglaize County correction facility as well as Celebrate Recovery services to both male and female inmates and after care services, helping them transition back into society.

We partner with other agencies throughout the county and try and fill the gaps in services that many residents are facing. Those agencies include, but are not limited to Auglaize County Crisis Center, Auglaize County Veteran Services, Auglaize County Department of Job and Family Services, Auglaize County Homeless Coalition, Auglaize County CERT, and Auglaize County Council on Aging.

Last fiscal year (Oct-Sept) we provided 11,151 units of service with a dollar value of \$217,000.00 to local individuals and families in need.

Council has been busy with a joint meeting with Synod and Internship committee at the end of June followed by our regular meeting on July 16. We also had a short meeting on July 23. We have been working hard to listen to results of the surveys we sent and to complete all of the process to have a congregational vote for Vicar Deb on August 13.

In our monthly meeting, we looked at the financial and Vicar's reports and also discussed any committee reports.

Property committee asked for approval to replace sinks and faucets in Melching hall restrooms. Cook's heating and plumbing was awarded the job.

We looked over and discussed a revised code of conduct for council members.
