Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

The apostle Paul wrote these words at the beginning of all his letters. I'm thinking and pondering the letter he wrote to the congregation in Corinth. This congregation was split, much as First English is: there are disagreements about who to believe,

which laws to follow, etc. Paul invites them to unite in Christ, (1 Cor 1:10-17) and to be informed by the view of love in 1 Cor 8:1-3, 1 Cor 13, and 1 Cor 16:14.

I invite you to pause right now, open your Bibles and read these texts, out loud. Take a few minutes between each one and share what comes to you, either writing or sketching in a journal, or verbally out loud with a partner. God is with God's people always, leading, caring, sitting with them in the junk and in the grief. May your hearts be open to God's presence.

Please, as you ponder how to go forward, be kind to one another, listen to each other, and go forth in faith as you are beloved children of God.

I will not be returning to First English to preach or lead. I give thanks for the clear message from God in the call vote, calling me into something new. I give thanks for the ministry we shared over the past three years. I give thanks for the growing in Christ we had. I give thanks for you. I pray God's wisdom be on you as you move forward as the body of Christ.

Bruce and I are thankful to have been part of the worshiping and faith community here over the past three years and we pray that the Holy Spirit be with you, now and always.
