

Out of love, not as judgment, Jesus offers him an open door to life: sell all you own and give it to the poor. Our culture bombards us with the message that we will find life by consuming. Our assemblies counter this message with the invitation to find life by divesting for the sake of the other.

⁶Seek the LORD and live, or he will break out against the house of Joseph like fire, and it will devour Bethel, with no one to quench it. ⁷Ah, you that turn justice to wormwood, and bring righteousness to the ground!

¹⁰They hate the one who reproves in the gate, and they abhor the one who speaks the truth. ¹¹Therefore because you trample on the poor and take from them levies of grain, you have built houses of hewn stone, but you shall not live in them; you have planted pleasant vineyards, but you shall not drink their wine.

²⁸Peter began to say to him, "Look, we have left everything and followed you." ²⁹Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or fields, for my sake and for the sake of the good news, ³⁰who will not receive a hundredfold now in this age—houses, brothers and sisters, mothers and children, and fields, with persecutions—and in the age to come eternal life. ³¹But many who are first will be last, and the last will be first."

- ★ Call Committee downloads NALC Call Process Manual for call committee members.
- x Call Committee chair contacts the NALC Call Process Coordinator to schedule a conference call for orientation/training. Met on September 15th.
- ★ Call Committee engages in Bible Study in the Call Process Manual. Meeting on Wednesdays at 6:45pm.
- x Call Committee chair will contact Mission District dean to arrange and complete <u>The Congregational Workshop</u> in preparation for the Call Process.
- ★ Chair contacts their Mission District dean to arrange and complete the Congregational Workshop – November 2, 9am-2:00/2:30pm.
- Call Committee completes the Congregational Profile and emails it to the Call Process office.

This workshop is for the **whole congregation** to give the Call Committee their input. It is an invaluable time for our congregation to come together and prayerfully seek our next pastor. The church council and Call Committee cannot do this on their own, they need the congregation to show up and participate in the next step of the Call Process.

The Call Committee also asks that as a congregation, we are praying for our next pastor and their family; for our own congregation in this time of uncertainty; and for our congregation to give it to God in his time and plan.

We are a church that needs a pastor, but we are a church together, each with our own gifts/talents to make up a congregation that supports one another together. No one person is left alone to work alone in our church.

Please look at your calendars and add the Congregational Workshop to it, many have busy schedules, but FELC needs you on November 2, 9:00am-2:00/2:30pm. Lunch will be carry-in meal; main dish provided, GFC's pulled pork; asking those attending to bring a side dish or dessert.
