We looked at some items that we weren't clear on, so we waited for some things to be cleared up before we approve them next month. Cari suggested effective immediately, Council president will now sign off on general operations of the Church.

The only committee report was fellowship, regarding the carry in meal and egg hunt on April 13 and a movie night in May.

Brenda talked a little on call committee update. She and Pastor Bert Schultz has discussed some different scenarios that we will be looking at.

We will be hosting a mission district meal and meeting with other churches probably on a Saturday in September.

4-5 members will be attending a Saturday Convocation with workshops on May 3rd in Springfield.

First English will have a small group to help with a kids against hunger project on Wednesday May 28 from 2-5. Trinity and Grace Lutheran in Jackson Center will be leading this mission.

Council approved a contract with Fuerst Lawn Care for our mowing this summer.

Ken Frame did a great job helping us last year.

Brenda discussed some building improvements that need to be addressed soon.

We have one bid and are waiting on another, for a roof leak at the back foyer by the Parlor. It will need to be patched along with some issues outside of Melching Hall.

We have been trying to make, calling a Pastor as our top priority, with our funds, but it is also just as important to have a building in good shape for the time when we do call our next Pastor.

Our next meeting will be April 27

The meeting was then adjourned.

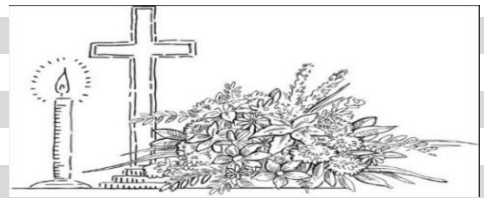
