Treasurer, Cari Frame was unable to join the meeting, so everyone looked over all the reports and Georgeann informed all of us that starting this month direct deposits for salaried positions are all set.

There were no actual committee meetings scheduled to discuss. Richard will be putting together a staff support meeting with everyone involved, in the near future. Brenda discussed several property issues happening right now. We did get a bid back to paint outside Melching Hall and the high white fascia places around the outside that will require a lift and the black railing around the church needing repainted. Council discussed the difficult time that property has had even getting any bids for this work, so with the help of Richard, we looked over the very reasonable bid from Wes Boyer which is approximately \$ 8000 and approved this job of maintaining our building, using the generous money from the Vohs fund. We also had to replace our garbage disposal in our kitchen that will be paid for by the Loaves and Fishes. The storm of last week caused the council room and nursery air units to malfunction. Perry's came out and reset them.

Adam's window washing came and cleaned almost all of our windows inside and out. They did a great job. Dave Krites reattached the outside light at the back foyer. The rest of this meeting continued in executive session.

Meeting was then adjourned, and next meeting was set for July 20, 2025.

TIPS FOR DONATING TO LOCAL FOOD PANTRIES:

If you have a large amount of produce, please call in advance to let the food bank know that you are coming.

No rotten produce—if you can't eat it, pantry clients cannot eat it!

Offer only good quality, freshly picked produce to food pantries.

Handle fresh fruits and vegetables safely to minimize the risk of foodborne illness. Don't mix produce types. Keep each type in separate, clean containers or bags. Clean as much mud and dirt as possible off of the produce you plan to donate. Choose produce without mold, spoilage, bruising, or insects.
