WORD

God speaks to us in scripture reading, preaching, and song.

FIRST READING: Revelation 14:6-7

A reading from Revelation. ⁶ Then I saw another angel flying in midheaven, with an eternal gospel to proclaim to those who live on the earth—to every nation and tribe and language and people. ⁷ He said in a loud voice, “Fear God and give him glory, for the hour of his judgment has come, and worship him who made heaven and earth, the sea and the springs of water.”

Word of God, word of life. **Thanks be to God.**

SECOND READING: Romans 3:19-28

A reading from Romans. ¹⁹ Now we know that, whatever the law says, it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced and the whole world may be held accountable to God. ²⁰ For "no human being will be justified in his sight" by deeds prescribed by the law, for through the law comes the knowledge of sin. ²¹ But now, apart from the law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed and is attested by the law and the prophets, ²² the righteousness of God through the faith of Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, ²³ since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; ²⁴ they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵ whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. He did this to show his righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over the sins previously committed; ²⁶ it was to prove at the present time that he himself is righteous, and that he justifies the one who has the faith in Jesus.

²⁷ Then what becomes of boasting? It is excluded. By what law? By that of works? No, but by the law of faith. ²⁸ For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law.

Word of God, word of life. **Thanks be to God.**

What do you mean by saying, ‘You will be made free’?” ³⁴ Jesus answered them, “Very truly, I tell you, everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin. ³⁵ The slave does not have a permanent place in the household; the son has a place there forever. ³⁶ So if the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed.

The minister addresses the baptismal group and the congregation.

HOLY BAPTISM

Presentation

P: In Holy Baptism our gracious heavenly Father liberates us from sin and death by joining us to the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. We are born children of a fallen humanity; in the waters of Baptism we are reborn children of God and inheritors of eternal life. By water and the Holy Spirit we are made members of the Church which is the body of Christ. As we live with him and with his people, we grow in faith, love, and obedience to the will of God.

A sponsor for each candidate, in turn, presents the candidate.

I present Roman Paul Schlegel to receive the Sacrament of Holy Baptism.

The minister addresses the parents.

P: In Christian love you have presented *this child* for Holy Baptism. You should, therefore, faithfully bring *him/her* to the services of God's house, and teach *him/her* the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments. As *he grows* in years, you should place in *him/her* hands the Holy Scriptures and provide for *his* instruction in the Christian faith, that living in the covenant of *his* Baptism and in communion with the Church, *he* may lead a godly life until the day of Jesus Christ. Do you promise to help your child grow in the Christian faith and life?

R: I do.

The minister addresses the sponsors.

P: Sponsors, do you promise to nurture Roman in the Christian faith as God's Spirit empowers you, and to help *him/her* live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church? Will you pray for *him/her* in *his/her* new life in Christ?

R: We do.

The Congregation joins in the profession of faith

Profession of Faith

I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the Church, the faith in which we baptize.

Do you renounce all the forces of evil, the devil, and all his empty promises?

R: I renounce them.

Do you believe in God the Father?

**I believe in God, the Father almighty,
Creator of heaven and earth.**

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit

And born of the virgin Mary.

He suffered under Pontius Pilate,

Was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended into hell.

On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven,

And is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit,

The holy catholic Church,

The communion of saints,

The forgiveness of sins,

The resurrection of the body,

And the life everlasting. Amen

Prayer of Thanksgiving

P: The Lord be with you.

R: And also with you.

P: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

R: It is right to give him thanks and praise.

P: Holy God, mighty Lord, gracious Father: We give you thanks, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and you created heaven and earth. By the gift of water, you nourish and sustain us and all living things. By the waters of the flood you condemned the wicked and saved those whom you had chosen, Noah and his family. You led Israel by the pillar of cloud and fire through the sea, out of slavery into the freedom of the promised land. In the waters of the Jordan River your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Spirit. By the baptism of his own death and resurrection your beloved Son has set us free from the bondage to sin and death, and has opened the way to the joy and freedom of everlasting life. He made water a sign of the kingdom and of cleansing and rebirth. In obedience to his command, we make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Pour out your Holy Spirit, so that this one who is here baptized may be given new life. Wash away the sin of all those who are cleansed by this water and bring *him/her* forth as an inheritor of your glorious kingdom.

To you be given praise and honor and worship through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen

Baptism

The minister baptizes each candidate by the pouring of water or immersion three times.

 Roman Paul Schlegel I baptize you in the name of the Father,

And of the Son, And of the Holy Spirit. Amen

The minister lays hands on the head of each of the baptized and prays:

God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, we give you thanks for freeing your *son/daughter* from the power of sin and raising *him/her* up to a new life through this holy sacrament. Pour your Holy Spirit upon *Roman* : the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence.

The minister marks the sign of the cross on the forehead of each of the baptized. Oil prepared for this purpose may be used. As the sign of the cross is made, the minister says:

P: *Roman* , child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.

A lighted candle (from the Christ candle) may be given to the baptized by a representative of the congregation:

Jesus said, I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will have the light of life. Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

The minister has a prayer for the parents

P: O God, the giver of all life, look with kindness upon *Cody & Roseann* . Let them ever rejoice in the gift you have given them. Make them teachers and examples of righteousness for their child. Strengthen them in their own Baptism so they may share eternally with their children the salvation you have given them, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Welcome of the Baptized

P: Through Baptism God has made this new *sister/brother* a member(s) of the priesthood we all share in Christ Jesus, that we may proclaim the praise of God and bear his creative and redeeming Word to all the world.

We welcome you into the Lord's family. We receive you as a fellow member of the body of Christ, child of the same heavenly Father, and worker with us in the kingdom of God.

***PRAYER OF INTERCESSION**

Let us pray in the name of Jesus to our heavenly Father for the Church, the world, and one another.

Thank you, dear Father, for all who love your Church. Thank you for raising up prophets, apostles, martyrs, theologians, and ordinary saints who treasure your holy Word and love your Church, even when she stumbles and sins. Thank you for Jesus, who makes the Church his Bride, and who even now makes her lovely with holiness, charity, and righteousness. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Pour out your Holy Spirit upon your Church. Make it your holy habitation. Keep it steadfast in your Word. Strengthen it in the face of temptation and defend it from evil. Purify it from sin and error and bestow on it your saving peace.

Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Graciously protect and guide the people of this congregation, O Lord, our Help and our Redeemer. Gladden our hearts by filling them with the gifts of your Holy Spirit. Use us to nourish, instruct, and invite our neighbors into your presence.

Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Bless the work of faithful theologians who clarify doctrine, correct misunderstandings, and teach the faithful. May their home and this church always be places where your grace is known and shared.

Noisy Offering for the month of OCTOBER: OPERATION CHRISTMAS

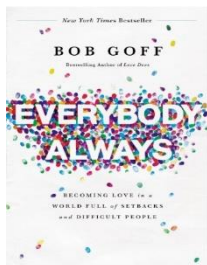
CHILD Offering pans are located in the chapel and at the back of the church. Donations are accepted during the entire month.
